## Another Year Behind Us

As 2021 quickly draws to an end, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your continued support and guidance despite the difficult couple of years that we have experienced. On top of the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic, 2021 will be remembered in BC for all the natural disasters that have affected us all. Whether it was the blistering heat of the heat dome in June, the forest fires that haunted many districts during the summer, or most recently the torrential rainfall which has left numerous areas flooded, it has been another trying year for the people of BC.



Reflecting on the events of the past year, we know that this wasn't the first time that natural disasters have struck, and it definitely won't be the last time. In fact, 2,500 years ago, Prince Siddhartha Gautama left the royal palace at the age of 29 years old because he realized that there was suffering in living and he sought out a path to liberate all beings from such suffering. Following 6 years of arduous practice, Siddhartha attained enlightenment under the Bodhi tree in the village of Bodhi Gaya. He was 35 years old at the time and it is said the event took place on December 8th. Every year, we hold the Bodhi Day service on the second Sunday of the month to commemorate this most important event in the life of the Buddha. This year we will be holding the Bodhi Day Service on December 12th starting at 10:00 am. In a world of great instability, the Buddha Dharma and the Nembutsu gives us peace of mind knowing that no matter what is going on that I am embraced by the Great Wisdom and Compassion of Amida Buddha.

Aside from the Bodhi Day Service, we are also planning on getting back to more in person activities at the temple. Two important upcoming events will be the Year End Temple Cleanup on Sunday, December 19th and the New Years Eve Temple Bell Ringing, or Joya-E in Japanese. In Japan, it is traditional at the end of the old year to clean one's home thoroughly as a way to cleanse the physical self, to start the New Year off with a fresh start.

Similarly, on New Year's Eve, people attend temples to listen to the temple bells being rung 108 times which is to represent the human defilements or the past actions from the previous year. In listening to the bells one is to cleanse the spiritual self, again to start the New Year off with a fresh start. The cleansing of oneself at the year end is an important custom in Japan, not only because it is cultural, but more because of the religious connotations. Cleansing oneself does not mean that we rid ourselves of the past, but it is a time to acknowledge both the bad and good events that occurred throughout the year and to be able to look forward to the New Year with a fresh mindset.

Throughout the past year we all have encountered many events. I hope you will join us for some of the year end events to spend some time reflecting on the past year and on New Year's Eve, as the rich tone of the Temple Bell fades gently into the night air, so the many events of 2021 will gently fade into our memories.

With sincere gratitude for the many encounters during this year, may I wish all of you a peaceful Holiday Season, and a fulfilling New Year.

 (親鸞聖人の正信偈より)

昨年の今頃、長い一年がようやく暮れになり、2021



年こそコロナウィルスのワクチンも開発されて希望を満たす年になりそうだと書きましたが、今年も残るところあと一か月になりましたが、去年に引き続き困難の多い年でした。カナダではコロナウィルスの予防接種を受けた人口も80%に及びながらも未だにパンデミックは収まりません。そして、今年はBC州にとっては自然災害の多い年でした。6月には記録更新するよう

な猛暑、7月と8月はかつてないほどの規模の山火事、そして11月に入ってからの大雨と洪水はこれから先も私たちの生活に影響を与えそうです。

求められたのです。そして、12月8日にボツガヤーというところの菩提樹の下で35歳の時に悟りを開かれたと言われています。お釈迦様の悟りを記念するために毎年12月の第二日曜日に成道会法要をおつとめしております。また、このような世の中であるからこそ、御仏のお導きが必要ではないかと思ひます。

浄土真宗の御開山親鸞聖人も800年前に天台宗の僧侶として20年間修行に励み、最終的にお念仏のみ教えに出会われたのです。親鸞聖人は財産や地位や名誉などよりも、どんな状況であろうと、今ここで仏法に照らされていることへの喜びを上記の「正信偈」の引用文に示されています。「一念喜愛の心」とは阿弥陀様の慈悲のはたらきに目覚めさせていただいた喜びの一念のことなのです。

今年の年末年始は去年できなかった除夜の鐘と修正会のお参りを行いますので、皆様もお寺にお参りにお出でになりませんか。

最後になりましたが、今年も皆様の暖かいご支援をいただき、お礼を申し上げます。皆様には穏やかで良い新年を迎えられますよう、念じ申し上げます。

『除夜』は『夜を除く』の略であり、この『夜』とは仏教の『煩惱の闇』を指しています。仏教では我々は皆百八つの煩惱を持っていると言われています。そして、百八つの除夜の鐘をつくたびに、今年自分の心におこった煩惱が消え去り、新年を清らかな心で迎えることができるといわれているのです。2021年の間に起きた全ての出来事が除夜の鐘の響きと共に夜空へ消え去っていく、2022年の元旦を新たな希望を抱きながら迎えたいと思います。大晦日の午後11時半から今年最後の法要がございます。その後、除夜の鐘を鳴らします。ご家族、お友達をお誘いの上、お越しくださいませ。
