

くなり多くの南アジア 人がそこで働くように なりました。製材所が 繁栄するにつれ、日系 カナダ人コミュニティ を含む他の民族の人々 も働くようになりまし た。パルディは、カナ ダで最も早く設立され た多文化の村の1つと



して知られています。私たちは幸運にも、 お盆ツアーは、8月10日から14日 地元のグルドワラに最近オープンした資料まで開催されました。8月10日(土) 館を訪れることができました。資料館はパの早朝に始まり、全員で47名の ルディの初期の入植者の物語を語り、日系 人の話もありました。ツアー参加者の一人 が実はパルディで生まれていて、展示され ていた1941年の小学校クラスの写真に自 分の姿を見つけました。この度のツアーで は、どの場所に行っても、ツアーグルー プの誰かが個人的なつながりをみつけま した。
