2024 Vancouver Island Obon and Japanese Canadian Historical Tour

"Kokoro no Tabi" – Journey of the Heart part 2



The following is a continuation of the report on the Vancouver Island Obon Tour "Kokoro no Tabi-Journey of the Heart".



Day three of the trip began with a visit to the Nanaimo Museum where we were able to see the travelling exhibit, "Broken Promises" which displayed the injustices that the Japanese Canadian Communities encountered prior to WWII. We also saw the permanent exhibit on the history of the Japanese Canadian Community in the Nanaimo area. Following some time for people to visit the exhibits, we gathered in

smaller groups and held sessions of what is known as "Healing Circles". The "Healing Circles" is a non-judgemental gathering to help individuals express their inner feelings. It was developed in the States by Dr. Satsuki Ina of the "Tsuru for Solidarity" organization. A couple of our organizing committee had already taken courses and were certified as facilitators for the "Healing Circles". A couple of others in our committee also took workshops enabling us to also become facilitators for the "Healing Circles". The inclusion of the "Healing Circles" was a great addition to the Obon Tour, as many expressed suppressed feelings of what it meant to be Japanese Canadian. It also brought everyone together as we were able to share tears of bonding with one another's stories.

Following the eventful morning at the Nanaimo Museum, the tour group stopped in Coombs where we enjoyed lunch at the Italian Restaurant, Cuckoo's Trattoria. After lunch, the bus continued on to Port Alberni where we held a Obon Cemetery Visit at the local cemetery. One of our temple

members had a brother who had died at childbirth who was in that cemetery. She mentioned it was very moving to be able to come and pay her respect with the rest of the group on such an occasion. In the evening, we held a fellowship gathering with people from the Japanese Canadian community in Port Alberni, and Ucluelet. They shared their stories of the Nikkei Community in Port Alberni, Ucluelet and Tofino.



Day four had our group head out to Cumberland where we started with a tour of the old mining site where the Japanese Canadians had a village before WWII. (Continued on P3)

Moe No Kai Keiko Go

Lately, the mornings and evenings are becoming darker and chilly, and we can feel the Autumn in the air. Our September Moe-No-Kai was held on the 12th and about 20 seniors showed up. Since Full Moon celebration (Juugova) was on September 17th this year, we made a very simple











decoration for the celebration. This time, we also used a real plant that resembles beautiful Japanese pampas grass that shines silver when exposed to the light. Rabbits and mochi dangos cannot be ignored for Juugoya celebration so the volunteers made them in advance with papers. Do you know why the rabbits are involved in the Juugova celebration in Japan? It comes from Japanese mythology. Long ago, a fox, a monkey and a rabbit met a kind old man who was starving for food. The three of them collected food for this old

man. The fox gathered fish, and the monkey gathered nuts and gave them to the old man, but only the rabbit could bring anything. not The rabbit felt bad for the old man and jumped into the fire to be eaten by him. What these animals didn't know was that this old man was a Great God named Taishakuten and was trying deeds these animals. on However, Taishakuten felt very sorry for the rabbit, so he brought this little rabbit back to his life on the moon. This is why jumping rabbits can be seen in the decorations of the Juugova celebration in Japan. Seniors also had a special treat with mitarashi and anko skewered mochi dangos just for this occasion. Our next Moe No-Kai will be held on October 17th. Please bring your friends and join us again.
