If you should come to realize this practice and shinjin, rejoice at the conditions from the distant past that have brought it about. But if in this lifetime still you



are entangled in a net of doubt, then unavoidably you must pass once more in the stream of birth-and-death through myriads of kalpas. Wholly sincere, indeed, are the words of truth that one is grasped, never to be abandoned, the right dharma all-surpassing and wondrous! Hear and reflect, and let there be no wavering or apprehension.

(From the Preface of The True Teaching, Practice, and Realization of the Pure Land Way)

As 2022 comes to an end, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your continued support and friendship throughout this past year. Reflecting over the past several years, we have all gone through so much with the horrible effects of the Covid-19 Pandemic, the ongoing war in the Ukraine, and the subsequent economic uncertainty that we are presently experiencing.

Despite the challenging times, 2022 was a year of hope. With the lifting of the pandemic restrictions, we were able to return to some semblance of normal activities at our temple. We held a successful Bon Odori and Obon service in July. Aoki Sensei from Vancouver joined us as our guest minister. It was the first Bon Odori in three years, and it was so nice to see so many people coming out, enjoying the festivities of the Odori.

In August, 45 individuals from the mainland took part in the Vancouver Island Obon Cemetery Visitation Tour. This year's tour was so much more than just visiting cemeteries. It was an educational trip as we did some sightseeing along the way, including visiting a couple of museums in Campbell River and Cumberland. It was a foodie tour as we enjoyed the many culinary delights of the Island in the various restaurants that we ate at. But most of all, the tour was a tour of connecting, as we were able to meet up with numerous local groups at the places we visited. A major highlight was being able to join in the Bon Odori with the Seven Potatoes Nikkei Group in Nanaimo. It is wonderful to see how the Vancouver Island Obon Cemetery Visitation has generated interest within the local groups on the Island to participate in Obon Ceremonies.

September saw us host the BC Jodo Shinshu Buddhist Temples Federation Convention. Even though the number of participants was relatively few, those who attended all enjoyed the weekend attending engaging workshops and a walking tour of the village of Steveston. This year's theme was "Paths", and we were able to examine a number of unique paths, such as the "Buddhist Path", "A Minister's Path", "Nikkei Fishermen's Path" and "A Jodo Shinshu Nikkei Internment Survivor's Path". It was an event filled weekend with our special guest minister being my brother Rev. Dr. Roland Ikuta from Lethbridge.

In October, we held the Keirokai Seniors' Appreciation luncheon. Although this is usually held in the spring, due to the pandemic, the luncheon was postponed until October. Everyone was enjoying one another's company after the long isolation due to the pandemic.

Hoonko 2023




Join us for the first time in three years as we get together in person to honoring our founder, Shinran Shonin with the Hoonko Weekend on January 21st and 22nd, 2023 weekend. Joining us in person will be our guest minister Rev. Yoshimichi Ouchi from the Toronto Buddhist Church.

Reverend Yoshimichi Ouchi was born in Oita prefecture, Japan. He grew up in a family Temple, where his grandfather and father were ministers. His family goes back 25 generations in the family temple. Buddhism and serving the Temple has been a life-long practice for Reverend Yoshi.

Reverend Yoshi studied religion, with a focus on Buddhism, at Ryukoku University in Kyoto and Shiga. After graduating from Ryukoku University, he went

to Chuo Bukkyo Gakuin (Central Buddhist Academy), a part of Nishi Hongwanji-temple, to study the Teaching of the Buddha and Shinran Shonin who was the founder of our sect in Kyoto.



Rev. Yoshi will be giving a public lecture on Saturday, January 21st starting at 3:00 pm. We will be hosting a Ho-onko Eve pot-luck dinner starting at 5:00 pm following the talk.

Also, the annual Multi-faith Remembrance Day Observance to acknowledge the participation of the Japanese in the World Wars was held in Stanley Park. As in past years, President of the British Columbia Jodo Shinshu Buddhist Temples (BCJSBTC) Federation, would present a wreath on behalf of the Federation at the Monument. This year it was Ted Akune.

The Remembrance Day Ceremony is most significant to Jodo Shinshu Buddhism as a number of the followers had fought in the World Wars. Noteworthy but perhaps unknown to many, is the fact that there is a six foot tall, three-sided Obelisk erected in the First Nations Gingolx Cemetery in Nishga, B.C., a village north of Terrace. This monument was erected in recognition of Japanese who had lived in the Nishga area and lost their lives in World War I, dated 1917. Engraved on one side of this monument are the words, Namo Amida Butsu, in recognition of their faith and on the second side are engraved the words - in memory of the Japanese who had fought in World War I. The gravesites for these fallen soldiers were found in the cemetery.

Indeed, the recognition and remembrance of these Jodo Shinshu followers who had fought for Canada in the World Wars is most significant and observed by many.


